Webinar: MN Legal Changes- Guardianship and Financial Exploitation

Last Month, Governor Walz signed into law two pieces of legislation that will greatly affect older and vulnerable adults in Minnesota. One set of changes updates and modernizes Minnesota's Guardianship and Conservatorship laws. Specifically, the law clarifies privacy protections for persons who may come under guardianship, requires analysis of less restrictive alternatives and supported decision making, and mandates time limited guardianship for persons under the age of 30. Another set of legal changes allow banks and credit unions to report possible financial exploitation and freeze suspicious transactions without fear of liability.
